What Does the Bible Say About New Year's Resolutions?

Question:

Every year, I always make a long list of New Year's resolutions, but since I never keep them, I've decided this time to make just a few. Does the Bible say anything about making resolutions?

Answer:

Yes, the Bible certainly encourages us to examine our lives and resolve to change them if necessary (although not just at the beginning of a new year). The Psalmist, for example, made a resolution to keep his speech pure: "I have planned no evil; my mouth has not transgressed" (Psalm 17:3).

Why, however, do so many of our resolutions fail? Sometimes it's simply because they aren't realistic. Instead, they're only wishful thinking, with no way to make them actually happen. For example, you might resolve to make a million dollars this year, but if you don't have any way to earn it, it probably isn't going to happen. Other resolutions fail because we aren't willing to make the sacrifices necessary to reach them.

But the real problem is within ourselves—within our own hearts and minds. We'd all like to be better people, but no matter how hard we try, we find ourselves tripped up by our own moral failures and weaknesses. Even the Apostle Paul experienced this: "I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out" (Romans 7:18).

What is the solution? The solution is to <u>turn to God</u>, confessing our sins to Him and seeking His help to live the way we should. Begin the New Year by turning <u>to Jesus</u> Christ and inviting Him into your life. Then <u>ask Him</u> to help you become the person He wants you to be. This is what Paul did, and that's why he could say, "I can do all this through him who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).

Begin the New Year with Christ.

Has it ever occurred to you that most of us fit into this category? We all want assurance that all will be well in our future. Doesn't it make sense that any level headed, sensible, responsible person then would give some serious consideration to the hereafter, to the security of his soul, and himself after this life ends? Surely the most of us will not say that we believe death is the absolute end of us, that there is no more, that death is total termination. Sure, we know that our bodies go back to dust, and will never return to this present life as we know it. But think for a moment... concentrate on an individual that you can see, touch and talk to right now. He is an individual, one of a kind, living, breathing human being. There is no one else exactly like him. You are you. No one else has the same characteristics, looks, idiosyncrasies, thoughts, feelings, fingerprints, etc. Being made of soul, mind and body, who can explain where you are, where your soul is, when your body dies? Your body can be seen but you are not there. Where are you? You have to be somewhere... That "somewhere" is in one of two places, Heaven or Hell! The moment your body gives up "you" and dies, your soul departs to one or the other.

Now, if we as mature, level headed adults look out for our future in this life, why do we not "take out insurance" or secure "assurance" that we will be taken care of after we leave this body, this life? Where will "you" go? Surely there is insurance, or assurance that you can secure to make sure you will go to a much better place. {Heaven} "But as it is written, eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him, 1 Corinthians: 2: 9" "But the children of the kingdom shall be cast into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, Matthew: 8:12." Hell will be eternal torment, pain, crying. Gnashing of teeth, burning in an unquenchable fire, agony, and total separation from God!
